About Camp El-O-Win

Camp El-O-Win is nestled among fir and pine trees about 15 miles from Shaver Lake (approximately 65 miles northeast of Fresno) at an elevation of 5,500 feet. The sparkling waters of Dinkey Creek run through camp. Which is surrounded by US Forest Service land. The camp is owned and operated by the Friends of Camp El-O-Win.

Registration, refund and Campership information is available on the Camp El-O-Win website www.campelowin.org under the CAMP tab. **Registration opens March 1, 2017.**

In 2017, two types of camping experiences are offered at Camp El-O-Win:

1. **Programs lasting 1 to 4 days.** El-O-Win volunteers provide program activities, supplies and all meals. Supervision is not provided during "free-time" activities or at night, therefore all girl participants must register with/or designate an adult participant as their chaperone. One adult may chaperone a group of girls. Adult chaperones pay a reduced fee.
2. **Group Camp** - Troops, families, co-workers, Bunco groups, church friends, fitness fanatics, neighbors, book clubs or school groupies of all ages....spend one or more relaxing days in the beautiful mountains. Explore, hike, fish, play games, enjoy nature, sit and read, draw, stargaze. Groups do their own program, prepare their own meals. **See 2017 Group Camp Information Handout.**

June 16 – 18: Group Camp 1 – Friday – Sunday. Limit 78

June 17: Saturday 10am to 3pm.

- **Open House** – Enjoy a few hours in the mountains. Take a tour of Camp El-O-Win and learn about her rich history. Bring a picnic or join the girls bridging from one Girl Scout age group to the next for lunch for \$10 a person.
- **Bridging** event – Troops bridging are invited to use the Camp El-O-Win Bridge for the special ceremony. Lunch will be served. Register through Girl Scout Council.

June 23 – 25: Friday 4pm to Sunday 11am.

- **Paddles – \$200 (Chaperones not participating in activities \$100)**
Canoeing Specialty Unit – Entering 9th - 12th grade. Must know how to swim. Complete several requirements of the Girl Scout Paddling Badge. Participate in other camp activities too! Limit 12 girls.
- **Spokes – \$200 (Chaperones not participating in activities \$100)**
Mountain Biking Specialty Unit – Entering 4th - 12th grade (beginner riders) – Learn the basics and spend your time at camp riding the trails. Participate in other camp activities too! Limit 12 girls.
- **Awl Those Strings! – \$200 (Chaperones not participating in activities \$100)**
Leather Art & Archery Specialty Unit – Entering 5th - 12th grade. Earn the Archery Badge and create something beautiful in leather. Participate in other camp activities too! Limit 12 girls.

July 7 – 9: Group Camp 3 – Thursday or Friday to Sunday. Limit 35

July 13 – 15: Thursday 11:30am to Saturday after breakfast

Adults only - activities include crafts, archery, horseback riding, swimming, canoeing, mountain biking, campfires. EOW provides meals/snacks and program. Limit 30.

July 14 – 16: Group Camp 4 – Friday to Sunday. Limit 35

- **Service Unit Frenzy – \$120 (Chaperones not participating in activities \$80)**

Entering 1st – 12th grade. This is an opportunity for Service Units (large or small) to end the summer with a bang! We will provide all the meals and snacks. Service Units can plan their own program or join with other Service Units to plan weekend activities. Limit 78.
