Camp El-O-Win is nestled among fir and pine with the sparkling waters of Dinkey Creek running through it. Camp is surrounded by US Forest Service land and is located 15 miles from Shaver Lake and 65 miles from Fresno. This 5,500 foot elevation camp is owned and operated by the Friends of Camp El-O-Win.

CHAPERONES: Campers attending weekend events must be accompanied by an adult chaperone. Chaperones must register to attend. One adult may serve as chaperone for more than one camper.
