All Campers and adults must submit a health history and permission slip. Failure to submit the forms or final payment by the deadline will result in the camper/adult being pulled from the event. **Campers need to register under their family, not as the member of a Troop/group under the Leader.**

Both weekends have the same Program Activities offered by age group:

Additional rides can be scheduled for Friday or Sunday. Full payment of the \$45 per rider must be paid with registration deposit to hold spot.

**REGISTRATION DEADLINE: July 26<sup>th</sup>**

Working in 4-person teams, girls will test their camping skills in Fire building, Knots, Lashing, First Aid, Compass, Tent Pitching and a Surprise Team Challenge.

Once registered, each group will receive the Scoutdoors Challenge Packet of event details. Preparation is essential. The sooner a group receives the Packet, the longer the group has to prepare and practice. Girls may compete in more than one skill, but all girls must compete in at least one skill.
