Girls, enjoy spectacular days of fun in the mountains, with friends on new adventures! Campers are supervised by trained adult Camp Staff at all times. Parents provide transportation to and from camp. Fee covers meals, program supplies and all activities.

All campers participate in flag ceremonies, horseback riding, mountain biking, nature, crafts, swimming, slingshots, s'mores, campfires, skits and singing. In addition, 4th thru 6th grade campers do archery and 7th thru 12th grades do archery and canoeing. Campers attending BOTH weeks stay at camp during the 1 day break.

CIT—Counselor In Training—for girls entering 11th & 12th grades interested in camp counseling. Develop skills, work with younger campers, see how a camp functions. Application and interview required.

Camp El-O-Win Facilities

Camp El-O-Win has three living units: Arapaho with cabins that sleep 4 to 6; Iroquois has 3 platform tents that sleep 5; and Chippewa has a cabin which sleeps 4 and 3 wooden-roofed teepees which sleep 10. When you sign up for an event, your unit and structure assignment are made on a first come first serve basis.
